Yes. The information is generally easily applicable to Veterans who did four years and received an honorable discharge. Retirees, Reserves and National Guard may apply.

2. DO ANY OF MY BENEFITS EXPIRE AS A VETERAN? (IVE BEEN OUT 10+ YEARS).

Some do, yet a lot in this book don't expire. It is still worth it to go through and check if you are still eligible!

3. IS THIS PART OF THE VETERANS TRANSITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM?

Not currently. After out-processing myself, I thought other veterans could use this. I am no VA expert; however, this knowledge was consolidated through 10+ veteran experts and counsel in various fields for truth and reliability.

4. WHAT IF I'M A VETERAN DOING GREAT NOW (CAREER/EDUCATION/STABILITY)?

That's the end goal! YET - there are many things in here that will still apply to you and your family to elevate your current physical, spiritual, mental, and financial well-being!



According to the VA: "If you received an other than honorable, bad conduct, or dishonorable discharge, you may not be eligible for disability".

0-100% DISABILITY

The VA's disability system for service members is rated 0–100%. 100% may be classified as permanent and total (P&T) or temporary.

SHORT OVERVIEW OF PROCESS

Start your intent to file for disability on VA's website. When you have all the necessary evidence, go ahead and file you claim. Depending on your claim, VA could schedule a compensation & pension (C&P) exam on each disability that you filed, and some do more than one. The next step is to see the 3rd party medical professionals (hired by the VA) in your area to evaluate your condition. Then the C&P physicians or psychiatrists will give their feedback about you to the VA to determine your rating. WHEN TO APPLY

Any veteran can file at any time. Recently transitioned active-duty veterans can do their intent to file one year from their date of separation (DOS) and receive backpay to their DOS. 2023's disability process takes 117-128 days for the VA to complete.

Intent to file reserves a potential start date of your benefits: start an intent to file ASAP!

WHAT YOU NEED

CHAPTER 15 IS AT THE END OF THE BOOK FOR HOW TO RETRIEVE DOCUMENTS IF YOU'VE GIVEN UP. DD214. Military medical records (and supporting documents), along with VA medical records (and supporting documents). Independent medical opinion (IMO) and/or medical nexus letter (detailed report from 3rd party doctor linking medical condition or disability to one or more events that happened during military service or to an already service-connected disability). \$\$\$ TAX-FREE COMPENSATION PAY CHART \$\$\$

Payments are on the first business day every month.

10% disability is \$165.92 — all the way through to 100% at \$3621.95 (without dependents). Veterans having a 30% or more service-connected rating may be entitled to higher disability compensation by adding their dependents such as children or parents.

MENTAL

PTSD, Somatic Syndrome Disorder, Major Depressive Disorder, Anxiety, Obsessive Compulsive Disorder, Chronic Adjustment Disorder, Bipolar Disorder, etc.



PHYSICAL

Scars, Limitations Of Range Of Movement, Paralysis, Degenerative Joints, Traumatic Brain Injury, Respiratory Deficiencies (Asthma), Diabetes, Cancer, Erectile Dysfunction, Arthritis, Lumbosacral Or Cervical Strains (Neck/Back Pain), Sleep Apnea, Tinnitus, Migraines, etc.

TOXIC EXPOSURE



Covered in detail in Recent AD and FW Vets.

SECONDARY CONDITIONS CLAIMS

Bruxism (excessively clenching/grinding teeth unconsciously),

Asthma, Erectile Dysfunction, Fibromyalgia (widespread musculoskeletal pain),

Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (digestive condition with stomach acid flowing upward),

Irritable Bowel Syndrome, Meniere's Disease (inner ear disorder leading to dizzy spells and hearing loss), Radioculopathy (nerve in spinal column is pinched and becomes inflamed),

Restless Leg Syndrome (uncomfortable leg sensations and irresistible urge to move them),

Sleep Apnea, Somatic Symptom Disorder (chronic pain syndrome with excessive focus on physical limitations causing impairment in functioning), Vertigo (dizziness, loss of balance, and feeling sick), Anxiety, Migraines, Lifestyle Impact Claim (how your service connected disabilities affect your life), etc.

PROVING DISABILITY

Proving a service connection relies on evidence such as medical treatment, diagnosis, opinions of medical and psychological professionals, and statements from friends, family, and veterans who served with you. Private medical records from your other healthcare providers may be used to support your claim.

HOW VA ASSIGNS DISABILITY RATINGS

VA bases ratings on the severity of the service-connected condition. They base ratings on the evidence given to them (doctors report, medical test results etc) and the results of your (C&P) exam, if you needed one. Other information they receive from other sources like federal agencies. https://www.va.gov/disability/about-disability-ratings/

COMPENSATION AND PENSION EXAM TIPS

Possibly the most important day for benefits. You talk through the severity of your symptoms, and go over both your VA and medical service records. Explain with detail how you are on your worst day.

"Occupational and social impairment". "My PTSD is so severe that I ____". Discuss the approximate month and year disability began. If you need to argue against the examiner's findings from your C&P exam(s), obtaining other medical opinions can help sway your claim.

20 OTHER DISABILITY COMPENSATIONS FROM VA



1. INCREASED DISABILITY COMPENSATION

If your disability and medical condition has gotten worse, you can file for an increase in compensation. VA may increase your disability rating with supportive new evidence that your condition has worsened if the law allows. The VA can change your existing rating (higher or lower) by opening up your claim for reevaluation. The VA must prove that your illness or disease has improved before they lower your rating

they lower your rating.
QUICK REQUIREMENTS: You have a rated service-connected disability that's gotten worse. Up-to-date medical evidence are required which shows your disability has gotten worse.

BENEFIT:

Open up your claim for re-evaluation and more monthly benefits.

You can file an appeal within VA's deadlines.

File a new claim for an increased rating.

File for TDIU based on unemployability.

File for secondary service connection.

2. SECONDARY SERVICE CONNECTIONS COMPENSATION

If a service connected disability you already have causes or aggravates another condition, you can file for secondary service compensation. This essentially links your initial service-connected disability to other conditions which have been aggravated.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

You are currently diagnosed with the secondary injury, illness, or disability.

You have medical evidence showing a nexus (link) between your connected condition and secondary condition.

BENEFIT:

A secondary disability can have a silver lining because even if your initial service-connected disability may have a low rating, your aggravated secondary condition may get a much higher one and improve your overall disability rating!

3) PRE-STABILIZATION FOR RECENTLY DISCHARGED VETS-TO 1 YEAR

For those who are just getting out of service in need of benefits, a temporary 50% or 100% may be given, depending on the severity of the condition. Your prestabilization rating will continue for one year after your discharge from active service.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

You have a severe service-connected disability that is unstable (hasn't been fully treated). Your disability is expected to continue for an unknown amount of time.

BENEFIT:

Can be given a 50% or 100% rating. You are eligible for temporary benefits right away.

4. 38.USC.1151 (KNOWN AS 1151 CLAIMS)

You can file this If VA was careless or negligent in your medical processes/surgery etc. If you are potentially additionally disabled by VA's treatment or vocational rehabilitation. Or if you pass away from the VA's care your family may be eligible to file.





5. INCREASED DISABILITY RATING FOR TIME SPENT IN HOSPITAL

If you're unable to work due to time spent in hospital – you may qualify for this compensation benefit!

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

You spent more than 21 days in a VA or other approved hospital for a service connected disability. Or you were under hospital observation for more than 21 days at VA's expense for a service-connected disability.

BENEFIT:

You may be able to receive temporary 100% disability for the time you spent in the hospital.

6. RECOVERY TIME FROM SURGERY OR CAST (IMMOBILIZATION TIME)

If one of your body's major joints are unable to move due to a cast you may qualify for these benefits. Or if you have had surgery there are certain requirements you may meet that allow you to qualify.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

BENEFIT:

You may be able to get a 100% temporary (one to three months, up to six months) disability rating, depending on the severity of your case.

You may receive added compensation payments while you recover.

7. COMBAT-RELATED SPECIAL COMPENSATION (CRSC)

If you have been injured in armed conflict, hazardous duty, instrumentality of war, or simulated war – you may be eligible.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Officially military retired with a combat related disability. You are entitled to retirement pay. You did not waive retirement pay for any reason other than disability. VA disability of 10% or greater and other requirements may possibly apply. Full info on criteria:

BENEFIT:

You can be retroactively paid back up to six years. 2022 CRSC potential full monthly amount is \$2,523.

8. VA TDIU (TOTAL DISABILITY BASED ON INDIVIDUAL UNEMPLOYABILITY)

If you are unable to engage in a substantially gainful occupation – you may likely qualify for 100%. Known as Total Disability Based on Individual Unemployability (TDIU), if your earnings are below the annual poverty level.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

The VA will send VA form 21-4192 to ask your previous employers to verify the dates of employment and indicate why you stopped working for that employer, however, you can already fill this out when you start to file for your TDIU claim. If you have only one service-connected condition, it must be rated at 60% or higher. If you have two or more service-connected conditions, you must have at least one condition rated 40% or higher, with a combined rating of 70% or higher. VA can still grant you TDIU benefits for outside factors called "extra-schedular requirements". Additionally, if you file for TDIU it means that you legally cannot work, compared to 100% P&T that has no job activity restrictions.

BENEFIT:

VA compensates you at a 100% rate.

Great option for veterans who are unable to work but haven't received a 100% disability rating.

9. VETERANS SERIOUSLY DISABLED CHILD - OVER 18

For veterans with older children who have disabilities you may be eligible.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

If a veteran has a service-connected disability, they also have an adult child with a mental or physical disability that renders them incapable of self-sufficiency. Children must be 18 of age or older, and be diagnosed with a mental/physical disability before the age of 18 with a permanent incapacity for self-support. Additionally, the child is currently disabled with a permanent incapacity for self-support.

BENEFIT:

Receive extra needed care for some children over 18 or 23. Children may qualify for health care benefits and services.

APPLY:

- A) Claim under 38 CFR 3.315(a)
- B) Contact your local VA office at 800-827-1000.



10. AUTOMOBILE ALLOWANCE/ADAPTIVE EQUIPMENT

You can receive up to \$22,355.72 toward the purchase of a specially adapted vehicle, alter your vehicle, or other transportation.

OUICK REQUIREMENTS:

If you are recognized by the VA as being unable to drive or if you have certain types of impairments. Example: loss of hands or feet, permanent decreased vision in both eyes, severe burn injury that limits motion, knee/hip joint immobility, ALS, etc. You must have been awarded service connection before buying the vehicle or installing adoptive equipment. Service length is not considered when VA determines eligibility, yet you need VA approval before purchase.

BENEFIT:

Receive compensation of up to \$22,355.72 if you are unable to drive or need special equipment. The purchase of a new or used automobile or other conveyance is a one time grant. Payments for adaptive equipment may be made multiple times during the veterans life.

11. SPECIAL MONTHLY COMPENSATION (SMC)

For those veterans who the regular 100% is not enough and are in need of extra compensation. The 100% disability's current rate is \$3,621.95 (with no dependents). Most of the SMC rates are awarded instead of the standard VA's 100%, instead of in addition to it, with the exception of SMC(K). Depending on your SMC level and dependents, your rate may be increased to \$10,365.53 (with no dependents) per month.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Must be awarded 100% service connection disability. SMC is not based on earning potential like regular disability. SMC is meant to be awarded for personal inconvenience, social inadaptability, or the profound nature of a disability.

This breaks down into various SMC levels based on the veterans situation.

Including SMC-L SMC-L 1/2 SMC-M SMC-M 1/2 SMC-N SMC-N 1/2 SMC-O

SMC-R- Vets who need assistance from another person to fulfill basic daily needs.

SMC-S- Vets who are unable to leave their homes due to disabilities.

SMC-T- Vets who have chronic symptoms caused by traumatic brain injury (TBI)

BENEFIT:

SMC is paid in addition to regular disability rating. Available for veterans who have serious disabilities or combinations of disabilities. ETC: housebound, in need of regular aid and attendance, immobile, unable to communicate, loss of senses, women veterans with loss of 25% or more tissue lost from a single breast or both breasts, radiation treatment of breast tissue, and other extremities. You may also add dependents. With a successful case, you may be entitled to back pay when your claim was pending.

12. CHILDREN WITH BIRTH DEFECTS FROM VIETNAM / THAILAND/ KOREA DMZ VETS

For children of spouses who have "Spina Fifida" or certain other birth defects. Including permanent physical or mental disabilities in the children resulting from the veterans association with specific chemicals. For the biological children of veterans with qualifying service in Vietnam or Korea.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

The child was conceived after the date on which the veteran first served in the Republic of Vietnam/Thailand/or in the demilitarized zone (DMZ) in Korea. Need the child's birth certificate, and the document showing the biological relationship between child and veteran parent. Need medical records with the diagnosis of Spina Bifida or another covered birth defect.

The veterans child can get health care, compensation payments, and job training or (VR&E benefits) including 24 months of educational training.

13. GERIATRICS/EXTENDED CARE - RESPITE CARE

Respite care is a program that pays for Veterans care when family caregivers need a break, need to run errands, or need to go out of town for a few days. Copays may be required based on income, assets, expenses, dependents, and health care. VA's extended care services form 10-10EC determines potential copayment rates.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Veterans must meet the clinical criteria, and the care services available vary by location. Additionally, the veteran meets the community eligibility if the respite care is provided by a community agency.

Home Respite Care:

A service that pays for a home health aide to come to a veterans home while their family caregiver takes a break or runs errands. Or the veteran could attend an adult health care center or a nursing home for the day.

Nursing Home Respite Care:

Pays for a veteran to go to a nursing home or community living center while the family goes out of town (available for a maximum of 30 days each calendar year).

14. VA AID AND ATTENDANCE / NURSING HOME / FAMILY CAREGIVERS PROGRAM

If you need extra assistance or know a veteran who does. This benefit can also be used if you or a veteran are living in assisted care facilities. This unique compensation benefit can additionally be paid to sons, daughters, neighbors, or hired help that are acting as caregivers in the veterans home!

You are not alone when you require help, aid, or attendance. Traveling and lodging costs may be covered when traveling with the veteran for healthcare purposes through the Beneficiary Travel Self Service System. APPLY:



15. VA PENSION BENEFITS (AVAILABLE TO SOME WARTIME VETERANS AND THEIR SURVIVORS)

If a wartime veteran who meets a certain age or disability requirements, and who has income and net worth within certain limits, they may be eligible for financial assistance.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Low income and little assets. Discharged from service from other than dishonorable conditions. Served 90 days or more of Active–Duty with at least one day during a period of wartime, or; you are permanently and totally disabled or age 65 or older (see full eligibility requirements via the link below). 2023 net worth limit for VA pension is \$150,538. Possible other requirements.

BENEFIT:

For older veterans and their surviving spouses, or those who know them. They are able to be compensated by filing for a monthly tax-free stipend which helps them take care of themselves. Additionally, this can be for war veterans with low income and who may have a disability that is not service-related.

16. HOME IMPROVEMENT AND STRUCTURAL ALTERATION (HISA) GRANT - #16-19 ARE ALL FOR HOME MODIFICATIONS

For entrances and exits in the home, lavatory and sanitary facilities, kitchen or bathroom, sinks and counters, paths and driveways. May improve plumbing and electrical systems for home medical equipment and more.

You may use this grant and the other ones listed (from #16-19) to help you buy a home to live in that's already adapted, remodel a home, or apply the grant to a mortgage balance of an adapted home not bought using VA grant funds.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Must include a prescription approved by a VA physician that includes the specific improvements to the home required, plus the diagnosis and medical justification for the improvement or structural alteration. Must specify itemized costs of labor, materials, and permits, and a photographed area to be modified.

BENEFIT: The most appropriate for veterans because the HISA grant is not limited to individuals with service-connected disabilities. Max limit is \$2,000 without service-connected disabilities. With service-connected disabilities (at least 50%) the max limit is \$6,800. Plus, renters can use their HISA grant funds to alter rental properties (must be approved by landlord/property management company).

17. SPECIAL HOME ADAPTION (SHA) GRANT

The VA provides up to \$22,036 for the SHA grant in 2023. However, the annual max grant amount adjusts based on the cost of construction.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Must be blind in both eyes, lost the use of both hands, lost function due to a burn, or have a significant injury respiratory in nature.

BENEFIT:

Similar to the SAH Grant. It allows veterans to live independently despite their injuries.

18. SPECIALLY ADAPTED HOUSING (SAH) GRANT (BARRIER-FREE LIVING)

According to the VA, the SAH grant provides up \$109,986 to construct or modify a home to meet adaptive needs. Max grant amount adjusts annually. If and after you receive the SAH grant, you may receive up to \$200,000 in mortgage insurance, paid directly to the mortgage broker or lender that holds your mortgage.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Loss or loss of use of both legs. Unable to move without the aid of braces, crutches, canes, or a wheelchair. Or loss of one leg and residuals or organic disease or injury. Or if you lost one arm and you are unable to move without aid. Loss or loss of use of both hands. Certain respiratory or breathing injuries. Blindness in both eyes with 20/200 visual acuity or less in better eye with use of a corrective lens. Have a severe burn injury.

BENEFIT:

For wheelchair accessible homes. Install ramps or widening doorways, handrails, roll in showers, and electrical outlets with this VA grant. Veterans can use the money up to six times throughout their lifetime, if they do not use all the funds right away.

19. TEMPORARY RESIDENCE ADAPTION GRANT

Provides SAH (up to \$44,299) or SHA (up to \$7,910) grant – if you need to fix a temporary family residence.

OUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Must be the primary home of veteran even if it's their current temporary residence.

Must have blindness in both eyes, or loss or loss of use of both hands, severe burns, certain respiratory injuries.

BENEFIT:

Veterans who qualify but live with family members in a permanent home can apply for a TRA grant to still meet their needs. Modify doorways, kitchens, bathrooms, and other parts of the home.

TRA grant process is the same as filing for SAH or SHA.

20. ADD OR REMOVE ANY DEPENDENTS ON YOUR DISABILITY

You may be able to get an added benefit rate by including your spouse, parents, children, adopted children, or stepchildren, who meets the eligibility requirements on your disability. Once your children turn 18, the VA will stop paying disability compensation unless you let the VA know they are enrolled in school full time or they became permanently disabled before they turned 18.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

You're eligible for VA disability compensation, and

You have a combined disability rating of at least 30%.

There are other specific requirements for dependents.

Additionally, if both spouses are both veterans with combined disability of at least 30%, both can receive the additional disability compensation for each other and for your children.

BENEFIT:

You can include your children or parents on top of your regular disability amount (also called a benefit rate.) Moreover, you may be paid back to the date of your marriage, or the birth or adoption of your child if you meet certain requirements.

VA FOLLOW UPS ON DISABILITY RATINGS - REEXAMINATIONS

Reexaminations If Your Rating is "Unprotected":

Unprotected disability ratings are those which are not deemed permanent and total or ratings that have existed for less than 5 years (however, the VA may still reevaluate your disability rating past the 5 year deadline if your condition has significantly improved, as shown by medical evidence). This means VA reexaminations can be scheduled to determine if your disability has improved, deteriorated, or has not changed. It is critical to attend or reschedule future VA examinations for them to "reevaluate" your disability rating, to make sure your benefits will not be automatically reduced or eliminated.

No Reexaminations If "Protected":

Your disability ratings are ruled permanent with no likelihood to improve. If your symptoms haven't shown improvement in over five years. You're over the age of 55 (except under unusual circumstances or where required by regulation). Your disability falls under a regulated scheduled minimum rating. If a combined disability evaluation (more than one condition) would not be affected even if one condition has improved. The only exception is if the VA can prove fraud, they can reexamine and possibly eliminate your benefits.

OTHER BENEFITS FOR RECEIVING DISABILITY

- Access a range of VR&E benefits (CH31) including an extra 12 months of Post-9/11 GI Bill. Requirements: 10%–20% disability rating and not dishonorably discharged.
- The VA Home Loan's funding fee is offset with 10% or greater disability. For example, it would save you a \$9,200 downpayment on a \$400,000 home (if your downpayment is less than 5%).
- Federal Hiring Preference: gives veterans a competitive edge over non-veterans both in hiring from competitive lists and in retention from reductions in force for federal jobs. Form SF15: https://www.opm.gov/forms/pdf fill/sf15.pdf
- Rating dependent disability may save you money in your state on tolls, city parking, property taxes, tax write offs, or other programs and fees. Examples include: car registration, and sportsmanship licenses.
- Disabled Veterans pursuing higher education may receive accommodations through their universities disability office to help with their coursework such as: extended assignment deadlines, priority course enrollment, quiet locations for exams, extended test times, ability to miss class for doctors appointments, and peer note taking assistance.
- You may add dependents such as children and parents to receive extra compensation onto your current VA disability.
- Clothing allowance may be provided if you have a service connected disability that requires the use of a prosthetic or orthopedic appliance, or certain skin conditions. The current annual allowance for this benefit is \$968.52.
- If your symptoms appear within one year after discharge, even if they weren't there while you were serving, the VA will conclude that they're related to your service (known as presumptive service connection).
- When flying through civilian airports, the Veterans Expedited TSA Screening (VETS) Safe
 Travel Act allows wounded warriors: amputee, paralyzed, or blind veterans with their
 children under 12 years old to go through TSA Pre-Check free with less hassle.

OTHER 100% DISABLED OVERVIEW:



SPACE A

100% P&T disabled veterans and their dependents can travel on SPACE A military flights around the continental U.S. with around a \$10 surcharge. Need to obtain a DD form 2765 (DoD/Uniformed Services Identification and Privilege Card (TAN) before taking the flight). You can review the flights for the Air Mobility Command's locations nearest you. Additionally, many military base's Space A terminals facebook groups outline flight schedules and seats available. STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM - PERMANENT AND TOTAL DISABILITY DISCHARGE

All federal loans may be paid off if you are a veteran with a 100% service-connected disability (with or without P&T) or if you are granted Total Disability Individual Unemployability (TDIU).

If you have loans from January 1st 2018 to December 25th 2025 there are no federal tax liabilities for the discharge. However, other loans taken out before or after this date will most likely be counted as "income taxes" and you may need to consult with a tax professional beforehand.

To cover all of your loans—only one application is required with all supporting documents and your lenders will be contacted. Great news: for veterans if they are approved for a total and permanent discharge (PTD) with VA documentation, there is no monitoring period. Extra info: for those submitting a PTD discharge based on SSA or a physicians certification, there is a post–monitoring period of three years where you have to submit annual earnings from employment where they verify you do not exceed the "Poverty Guideline Amount", as of 2023 it is \$19,720 (family of two). Previous loan payments may be repaid, according to the effective date of your disability rating.

Nearly all student loans (FFEL loans, Program loans, Perkins loans, or Direct loans) and TEACH grant service obligation may be discharged. Private loans with other lenders may be allowed and discharged (need to contact your lender). The discharge review process typically takes 30 days.

100% DISABLED DEPENDENTS EDUCATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

100% service-connected disabled or if your the spouse or child of a veteran who has passed.

BENEFIT: The dependents education assistance (DEA) program can provide education benefits for spouses and children of permanently disabled veterans for up to three years and nine months. Along with free vocational and education counseling through the VA.

BASE BX, COMMISSARY, AND MWR FACILITIES ACCESS FOR 0-90% DISABLED VETERANS



Newly eligible veterans with a service-connected disability rated 0-90% and other than dishonorable discharge may now access the base's BX, Commissary, and Morale Welfare & Recreation (MWR) facilities with no higher costs except for a commissary credit card fee.

100% already have DoD access to base amenities. MWR includes recreational lodging and resorts, special interest activities, marinas, equipment check out, camping, vehicle storage and more. MWR can save you thousands compared to outside stores.

Depending on the installation, 0–90% veterans have to pass an initial background check at the visitor center and then may obtain recurring access to enter through the gates. Need a Veterans Health Identification Card (VHIC) with one of the required designations (service-connected, purple heart, etc, on the front). Approved family caregivers are also eligible.

OFFICIAL VA HEALTH CARE RATING SYSTEM

The VA has priority groups #1-8. A lower number means a higher priority group for health care. The VA assigns you to a group based on military history, disability rating, annual income, and more. Each one of the eight VA groups differs on your amount of free health care, benefits, etc.

VA CARE TEAM



FROM THE VA: After you sign up for VA health care and choose your main VA location, we'll assign you to a health care team called a Patient Aligned Care Team (or PACT). Your team will be made up of you, those who support you (like your family members and caregivers), and your health care providers.

Your team will include a:

- Primary care provider (your main doctor, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant).
- Clinical pharmacist (a pharmacist who works with you and your primary care provider to make sure you're taking the medicines that are right for you and your overall health).
- **Registered nurse (RN) care manager** (a nurse who makes sure your care is coordinated across all providers and services, and meets your health goals and your plan for care).
- Licensed practical nurse (LPN) or medical assistant and clerk (team members who help to support you and the other health care providers on your team).

When you need other services to meet your goals and needs, your team may call other providers—like social workers or specialists—to help with your care.

MEDICAL COORDINATION — PRIMARY HEALTH CARE DOCTOR — FIRST



FROM THE VA: We'll assign you a health care team—including your primary care provider—based on the location you choose.

Primary Care now serves as the foundation of VHA health care and became the first point of contact with the health care system for Veterans enrolled in Veterans Health Administration (VHA).

Your primary care doctor will "refer" you to do consultations and other medical work. For example, you'll see your primary care doctor in person or message them (through the VA app) and then they will liaison your information to other clinics and departments. Then these other departments will call you or you will have to call them for an appointment. After you see these other departments, your test results or findings usually circle back to your primary care doctor.

EYE CARE THROUGH THE VA



VA health care covers routine eye exams, preventative, and rehabilitative vision care. Receive prescription frames, eyeglasses, sunglasses, medically necessary contact lenses. LASIK, RPK, and cataract surgery can be covered by VA benefits.

Some medications like antidepressants might increase the risk of eye health problems.

You can also receive one free pair of eyeglasses per year from VA if you have any service-connected disability.

DENTAL CARE THROUGH THE VA



SOME REQUIREMENTS: VA dental care is available to 100% disabled veterans or those which receive Total Disability based on Individual Unemployability. However, there are also other avenues. Furthermore, there are ten different classes that qualify you for treatment in the VA's system.

Additionally, dental Insurance is available at a reduced cost through the VA Dental Insurance Program (VADIP) if you meet certain requirements. VADIP requires veteran to be signed up for the Civilian Health and Medical Program (CHAMPVA) and signed up for VA Healthcare.

Coverage ranges from \$25-\$200 monthly depending on which VADIP plan you choose and how many dependents you enroll.



Veterans, service members, and their qualified family members can receive assistance from the VA's Education and Training Benefits. This includes paying for college tuition, choosing the best school or training program, and receiving career guidance.

POST 9/11 GI BILL (CH33)



Over the course of a four year degree, the Post 9/11 GI Bill will pay over \$100,000. For 2023, it pays up to \$26,381.37 per year for tuition and then added benefits.

After applying online: the VA will send you a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) that spells out what you are eligible to receive in payments, then you present this document to your university. Depending on your service, the Post 9/11 GI Bill usually gives 36 months of benefits, equaling four years of schooling benefits total. One year in college is nine months, because three months count toward semester breaks.

POST 9/11 GI BILL CONSIDERATIONS



If your service ended before Jan 1, 2013 - your benefits will expire 15 years after your date of seperation (DOS).

If your service ended after Jan 1, 2013 – your benefits won't expire due to the new Forever GI Bill.

Education claims take around 30 days.

Current policy: you can transfer your unused GI bill to family members if you have served an overall 10 years total. Or for those who served at least six years in the military and who agree to serve at least another four years.

With specifications: the VA may possibly back-pay you (by taking adequate months from your GI Bill Benefits) for a trade school or course you have taken by sending in a receipt to the VA.

POST 9/11 GI BILL COMPENSATION



Receive an annual stipend allowance of \$1,000 a year for books and supplies based on your credit hours (this equals \$41.67 per credit certified in 2023).



Where applicable, a possible one time \$500 rural relocation travel allowance payment to move to your university.

Post 9/11 Gi Bill Basic Allowance For Housing (BAH, also known as MHA): Receive BAH allowance if are considered a "Full Time Student" based on the campus's zip code where you take the most classes. VA pays BAH for the days you attended class, so if your term starts in the middle of January, the payment you receive in the beginning of February will be pro-rated accordingly. For part time



Tutorial Assistance: If you're using VA education assistance, VA may help pay for a tutor. VA specifies that they'll pay \$100 per month for tutoring equaling \$1,200 in total per year.



VA'S VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION & EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS (VR&E CH31) (VOC REHAB)

Given to veterans other than dishonorably discharged with a 10% or 20% disability or greater. Goal: to achieve maximum independence in daily living.

VR&E's 5 tracks to employment:



1. RE-EMPLOYMENT TRACK

Helps you return to your former job and support your employer in meeting your needs. May involve accommodation and/or modifying the workplace to make it more accessible. VA provides reemployment rights, advice, work adjustment services, adaptive equipment, and specialized consultations necessary for a successful return to work.



2. RAPID ACCESS TO EMPLOYMENT TRACK

For individuals who are seeking employment and already have the necessary skillsets. VA provides expert career-placement assistance, referrals, and other specialized assistance. Additional services include: career readiness, job accommodations, short term certificate training, resume service, and post employment follow up.



3. SELF-EMPLOYMENT TRACK

For individuals who have the skills to start their own business. Also for those who have limited access to employment or need flexible work schedules. VR&E services may include: developing a viable business plan, training in the operation of a small business, marketing and financial assistance, guidance on implementing a viable business plan, tuition for training and licensing fees. VA may also assist with some business start-up costs.



4. EMPLOYMENT THROUGH LONG-TERM SERVICE TRACK

To help individuals receive the education or training to find work in a different field. VR&E provides for the cost of all tuition, books, fees, equipment, and provides a monthly subsistence allowance during training. Services may include: training and/or education for college or certification programs, on the job training, non-paid work experience, job sharing, work monitoring, work study, public-private job partnering, apprenticeships, and internships.



5. INDEPENDENT LIVING TRACK

If you can't return to work right away, you may qualify for services that can help you live as independently as possible. VR&E services may include help in obtaining a volunteer position, connecting with community-based support services, providing assistive devices, increasing access within the home or community, and help in becoming more independent in daily living activities. VA will provide the services or equipment needed to reach independent living goals. https://www.va.gov/careers-employment/vocational-rehabilitation/programs/



Ask your VR&E Counselor about Reimbursements:

VR&E benefits may authorize travel expenses that are beyond your daily commute.

Including lodging, subsistence, tolls, or allowance based on mileage (2023's 41.5c a mile). Situations include: to reach a VR&E office, reporting to a training school, returning home, and/or to start a pre-arranged suitable employment. The form to file is VAF 10-3542. It needs your signature and an authorized VR&E staff member's. Must be filed within 30 days and with all furnished receipts.

VR&E benefits add an additional 12 months of school, for 48 months of education benefits total, on top of the 36 months for Post-911 GI Bill if you qualify upon speaking to your advisor.

RECEIVING COLLEGE CREDITS FOR MILITARY SERVICE



As a Veteran, you'll need to request your transcript from your branch of service and share it with schools. Each school then decides how many credits they'll accept. Your transcript shows how many credits the American Council on Education (ACE) recommends for each experience, including: your military occupation specialty (MOS) training, army advanced individual training (AIT), military jobs, and completed courses.

Your transcript may also list courses or jobs not evaluated by ACE. Additionally, if you have taken CLEP or DSST exams funded by DANTES when in the military, these can count as college credit. We've included the the links below on how to retrieve them through Parchment.

TYPES OF HOME LOANS



1. VA HOME LOAN

The purpose of VA home loan guarantees is to "assist qualified military members, veterans, reservists, and unmarried surviving spouses in purchasing homes, condominiums, mobile homes, residential cooperative housing units, and refinancing loans".

The VA home loans purpose: for veterans personal primary residence.

2. VA'S JUMBO LOAN

When buying luxury homes, jumbo loans still may still consist of the flagship \$0 down payment. They are typically used when you're buying in high-cost areas and your loan amount exceeds the county-specific VA loan limit of around \$726,200, or around \$1,089,300 in high-cost areas.

There is no maximum VA loan amount set by the government; however, you still must qualify with adequate income, credit score, etc.

VA HOME LOAN CAN COVER

In the event that the borrower defaults on the loan, a VA guarantee helps lenders avoid financial loss. You can use it to apply for a loan to:



1. NEW BUILDS ON NEW LAND

Simultaneously purchase a lot of land and complete a new build. Stipulations include: "no more than four units on one property and you must live in one".



2. RENOVATE FIXER UPPERS

Purchase a fixer upper to renovate! Borrow the amount you need and the money for renovations.



3. WORKING FARMS

You can use VA loan to buy a working farm with no acre limit if you intend to live there. Few requirements:

VA HOME LOAN FUNDING FEE

If you have no disability rating, you can still push back the funding fee into your loan, instead of paying it upfront. The VA's "funding fee" will be waived if you have a 10% or more service-connected disability.

VA limits closing costs.

100% or Other Qualifiable Disabled Veterans Can Qualify For:

Specially Adapted Housing (SAH) Grant: up to \$109,986

Special Home Adaption (SHA) Grant: up to \$22,036

Temporary Residence Adaption: Provides SAH (up to \$44,299) or SHA (up to \$7,910) grant to fix a temporary family residence.

HISA GRANT: Provides for home improvements necessary for the continuation of treatment.



HISA GRANT

For entrances and exits in the home, lavatory and sanitary facilities, kitchen or bathroom, sinks and counters, paths and driveways. May improve plumbing and electrical systems for home medical equipment and more.

You may use this grant and the other ones listed (from #16-19) to help you buy a home to live in that's already adapted, remodel a home, or apply the grant to a mortgage balance of an adapted home not bought using VA grant funds.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Must include a prescription approved by a VA physician that includes the specific improvements to the home required, plus the diagnosis and medical justification for the improvement or structural alteration. Must specify itemized costs of labor, materials, and permits, and a photographed area to be modified.

BENEFIT: The most appropriate for veterans because the HISA grant is not limited to individuals with service-connected disabilities. Max limit is \$2,000 without service-connected disabilities. With service-connected disabilities (at least 50%) the max limit is \$6,800. Plus, renters can use their HISA grant funds to alter rental properties (must be approved by landlord/property management company).

SPECIAL HOME ADAPTION (SHA) GRANT

The VA provides up to \$22,036 for the SHA grant in 2023. However, the annual max grant amount adjusts based on the cost of construction.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Must be blind in both eyes, lost the use of both hands, lost function due to a burn, or have a significant injury respiratory in nature.

BENEFIT:

Similar to the SAH Grant. It allows veterans to live independently despite their injuries.

SPECIALLY ADAPTED HOUSING (SAH) GRANT (BARRIER-FREE LIVING)

According to the VA, the SAH grant provides up \$109,986 to construct or modify a home to meet adaptive needs. Max grant amount adjusts annually. If and after you receive the SAH grant, you may receive up to \$200,000 in mortgage insurance, paid directly to the mortgage broker or lender that holds your mortgage.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Loss or loss of use of both legs. Unable to move without the aid of braces, crutches, canes, or a wheelchair. Or loss of one leg and residuals or organic disease or injury. Or if you lost one arm and you are unable to move without aid. Loss or loss of use of both hands. Certain respiratory or breathing injuries. Blindness in both eyes with 20/200 visual acuity or less in better eye with use of a corrective lens. Have a severe burn injury.

BENEFIT:

For wheelchair accessible homes. Install ramps or widening doorways, handrails, roll in showers, and electrical outlets with this VA grant. Veterans can use the money up to six times throughout their lifetime, if they do not use all the funds right away.

TEMPORARY RESIDENCE ADAPTION GRANT

Provides SAH (up to \$44,299) or SHA (up to \$7,910) grant – if you need to fix a temporary family residence.

QUICK REQUIREMENTS:

Must be the primary home of veteran even if it's their current temporary residence. Must have blindness in both eyes, or loss or loss of use of both hands, severe burns, certain respiratory injuries.

BENEFIT:

Veterans who qualify but live with family members in a permanent home can apply for a TRA grant to still meet their needs. Modify doorways, kitchens, bathrooms, and other parts of the home. TRA grant process is the same as filing for SAH or SHA.



AFGANISTAN AND IRAQ VETERANS



To seamlessly assist badly injured service members returning from Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) as they transition from the military to civilian life, the VA has stationed employees at significant military hospitals.

FREE HAZARDOUS EXPOSURE TESTS

Exposure Related Health Concerns from Hazards and Harmful Substances. Including Chemicals, Radiation, Air Pollutants, Occupational Hazards, and Warfare agents.

FREE TESTING FOR VETERANS.

Contact your local VA's Environmental Health Coordinator. These tests are free and require no copayment, or enrollment in VA's Health Care. However, it may result in increased Health Care and Disability Compensation benefits. It is based on your recollection of service to register. For disability, exposure is verified. The VA has six main registries—yet we've included other hazards vets are exposed to. AGENT ORANGE OR OTHER HERBICIDES

If you served in Vietnam/Korea/Thailand. This includes Blue Water Navy Veterans who came within 12 miles of the coast of Vietnam. Or if you have worked on C123 aircraft. Or if you possible herbicide exposure due to DoD herbicide tests and storage at military locations.

INSECTICIDES AND PESTICIDES (DEET & LINDANE)

Southwest Asia areas: Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, the neutral zone between Iraq and Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Qatar, (U.A.E), Oman, Gulf of Aden, Gulf of Oman, waters of the Persian Gulf, the Arabian Sea, the Red Sea, and the airspace above these locations. Pesticides used in the Gulf-War include: lindane to treat uniforms, DEET used on the skin as an insect repellant, and others.

INDUSTRIAL SOLVENTS (PAINTS, CLEANERS, VAPORS)

Many service members use industrial solvents (usually liquids) for cleaning, degreasing, paint stripping, and thinning with oil-based paints. Exposure to solvents may be dangerous to your health. Exposure includes: inhaled vapors, direct eye contact, skin contact, or ingestion. Common products with solvents: fuel, adhesives and glues, resin, primers, hardeners, and paint.

PFAS SUBSTANCES (FIREFIGHTING FOAM ETC)

For military firefighters who were exposed to the industrial chemicals in fire-fighting foam known as PFAS. New "VET PFAS Act" introduced in 2022, recognizes that firefighters who developed related diseases are eligible for VA's PFAS compensation.

DEPLETED URANINUM (BURNING VEHICLES)

If you served in the Gulf War, Bosnia, Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF), Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF), or Operation New Dawn (OND). Veterans may have been exposed to depleted uranium if they were on, in, or near vehicles hit with friendly or hostile fire, if they entered or were near burning vehicles, if they salvaged damaged vehicles, or if they were near fires involving depleted uranium munitions.



AIRBORNE HAZARDS AND OPEN-AIR BURN PIT EXPOSURES

If you were deployed in multiple countries including the Southwest Asia Theatre of Operations. Operations and campaigns include: Desert Shield and Desert Storm, Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom, and New Dawn. Airborne hazards include: smoke and fumes from burn pits, sand, dust, particles, and general air pollution. Fuel fumes, aircraft exhaust, and other mechanical fumes are included as well as smoke from oil well fires.

SAND, DUST, AND PARTICULATES FROM DUSTY ENVIRONMENTS

For veterans deployed to the Persian Gulf, Afghanistan, and other dusty environments. Exposure sources to very fine particulate matter from air pollution during deployments include: windblown dusts, fires, construction activities, power plants, incinerators, and automobiles. Serious respiratory problems may emerge since small particulates can be inhaled deep into the lungs and airways.


For veterans who participated in a radiation-risk activity during service—including "Atomic Veterans"; the VA assumes that certain cancers are related to their exposure. Radiation exposure includes site accidents or clean up missions. Occupational exposure includes those veterans who served on nuclear submarines and other nuclear ships or in shipyards. Or veterans involved in nuclear weapons handling and maintenance. Or veterans who served as X-ray or dental technicians.

CHEMICAL AND BIOLOGICAL WEAPONS

The DoD concluded about 100,000 Gulf War Veterans could have been exposed to low-levels of nerve agents in the atmosphere, following a 1991 demolition of munitions storage in Iraq.

CHEMICAL WARFARE AGENTS (OIF) AND NERVE AGENTS

Service members who demolished or handled explosive ordinance may have been exposed to warfare agents such as mustard agents, sarin, tabun, soman, and VX. Long-term health effects are not expected after low levels of exposures with minimal to no symptoms. Some veterans may have been exposed to nerve agents during a combat or terrorist situation. The nerve agent may be in gas, aerosol or liquid form.

NOISE

For veterans who have been exposed to harmful noise during military service in combat, training, and general job duties. Noise can come from gunfire, explosives, rockets, heavy weapons, jets, other aircraft, and machinery. High-intensity noise and vibration can contribute to hearing loss and tinnitus (ringing in the ears).

VIBRATION

Veterans who worked with machinery on a regular basis during military service may have been exposed to: hand-arm vibration from using power hand tools and whole-body vibration from operating heavy equipment such as trucks, helicopters, and ships. Continuous vibration exposure may cause serious damage to the body, including tingling, numbness, pain, etc.

FUELS (PETROLEUM, OILS, AND LUBRICANTS)

For veterans who have been exposed to fuels, such as diesel and JP8, through operating machinery or jet exhaust blast. Possible health effects depend upon how they were exposed (skin, oral, or breathing), length of time exposed, and personal factors. If an individual is exposed to fuel at very high levels over a long period of time, lung and heart problems may develop.

LEAD

Veterans may be at risk for elevated lead levels if they have spent many days at indoor firing ranges—such as in a special operations unit. Or they've had contact with lead-based paints that were deteriorating, or through drinking water from old lead pipes. Veterans could have had contact with elevated lead levels in the air, dust, soil, water, and some other commercial products.

CARC PAINT

Chemical agent resistant coating is a paint used on military vehicles to make metal surfaces highly resistant to corrosion and penetration of chemical agents. Gulf War Veterans who painted, welded, sanded, or helped dry combat vehicles and equipment during their military service may have been exposed to CARC paint or fumes without adequate respiratory protection. Other veterans who painted tanks, armored personnel carriers, and other motor pool equipment may have been exposed.

ASBESTOS

Veterans who served in any of the following occupations may have been exposed to asbestos: mining, milling, shipyard work, carpentry and construction, insulation work, and old building demolition. Also, veterans who served in Iraq and other countries in that region could have been exposed to asbestos when older buildings were damaged and contaminant released into the air.

Symptoms of asbestos-related diseases, such as shortness of breath, coughing, and chest pain often do not appear until 20 to 50 years after the exposure.

TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURIES - TBI

The VA suggests a veteran should be screened for a TBI if they experienced the below incidents during their military service. If they've been in close proximity to a blast or explosion (IED's, artillery, rocket or mortal shells, traps, aerial bombs, or grenades). Or, if they've received a fragment wound or bullet above the shoulders, a blow to the head, a motor vehicle accident or crash, a fall, or any incident involving a sudden blow or jolt to the head. Even mild TBI's (concussions) can affect a persons physical functioning and mental health.

VACCINATIONS AND MEDICINES DURING SERVICE

For veterans who are concerned about or received certain side effects or reactions from certain vaccines and medications while in the military. These vaccinations include: the Gulf War vaccinations (anthrax and botulinum toxoid) for biological warfare protection, the pretreatment drug (Pyridostigmine bromide) taken by veterans in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm to protect against nerve agent attacks, the malaria prevention vaccine (known as: mefloquine or lariam), and the smallpox vaccine.

COLD INJURIES

Veterans who may have been exposed to extreme cold in combat and military training missions. Cold injuries may result in long-term health problems. This includes the following symptoms at the exposure site: changes in muscle, skin, nails, ligaments, and bones. Skin cancer in frostbite scars. Neurologic injury with symptoms such as bouts of pain in the extremities, hot or cold tingling sensations, and numbness. Or extremities becoming painful and white, or discolored when cold.

HEAT INJURIES

Veterans who served in hot desert climates, such as in Iraq and Afghanistan, may have suffered from heat injuries. These heat injuries include heat stroke, heat exhaustion, and sunburn. Veterans who have suffered from heat injuries during military service may be more susceptible to heat and more serious heat injuries in the future.

HAZARDOUS EXPOSURE FOR DISABILITY




MK9 SERVICE DOGS




GUARDIAN ANGELS MEDICAL SERVICE DOGS





This section is mentioned because if you are renting some places don't allow pets. For veterans, a free note written by your mental health provider can allow you to move forward with more housing choices if desired. Note that the legal ESA protections afforded traditional service animals vary by states.







HEALTH CARE FOR HOMELESS VETERANS PROGRAM (HCHV)

Bridges the gap for homeless veterans with housing, health care, and case management services that promote safe and stable living arrangements. The average number of veterans served through HCHV programs annually is 150,000.

REQUIREMENTS: Veterans are eligible

HOMELESS PATIENT ALIGNED CARE TEAMS (HPACTS) PROGRAM

Fights veteran homelessness. Provides veterans with comprehensive, individualized care, including services that lead to permanent housing (located on the campuses of VA medical centers). Veterans can walk into HPACT clinics without an appointment and receive medical care, case management services, housing placement supports, substance abuse and mental health treatment, community referrals, triage services, benefits counseling and even hot showers and clean clothes. It is estimated that over 22,000 veterans are served by HPACT's annually. Designed to reach veterans living on the streets—or in cars, shelters, or other unstable situations—and assist them with finding the housing of their choice, even if they use alcohol or drugs or have chronic health issues.

HOMELESS VETERANS DENTAL PROGRAM (HVDP)

To honor America's veterans, particularly those who are facing homelessness, by facilitating improvements in access to oral health that contribute to their overall well being and to their success in VA sponsored homeless rehabilitation programs. Find one in your area by contacting the nearest VA hospital and ask for the homeless coordinator's office, and then ask them about the homeless veterans dental program.

JUSTICE SYSTEM SOLUTIONS FOR VETS



VETERANS JUSTICE OUTREACH

Their mission is to identify and provide outreach to justice-involved veterans in order for them to facilitate access to VA's services at the earliest possible point. Veteran justice specialists are located in every state. They can provide support to prisoners like a reentry plan, mental health and substance services, and more. No veteran is forgotten.

VETERANS TREATMENT COURTS

41 states have at least one established veterans treatment court since the Veterans Treatment Court program started in 2009. Instead of "having all veterans appear before random judges", certain states have specific departments or divisions within existing courthouses for certain qualifiable veterans with judges and representatives who are familiar with veterans situations. Instead of a veteran facing prison time, there could be a monitoring program instead with the VA. VA's 2015 study estimates there are "to be 181,500 incarcerated Veterans" in federal prisons, and state jails.

RE-ENTRY VETS ACCESS TO SERVICES




HEALTH CARE FOR RE-ENTRY VETERANS

Designed to promote success and prevent homelessness among veterans returning home after incarceration. HCRV specialists work with veterans to ease their transition from prison back into the community. HCRV specialists meet with incarcerated veterans before they're released and assist them in planning for reintegration into the community by accessing VA and community services as well as housing and employment opportunities.

WOUNDED WARRIOR FOUNDATION

Requests for assistance can usually be fulfilled in two business days. May cover with stipulations: past-due rent or mortgage, past-due utilities with shut-off notice, hotel for shelter purposes, food, child care, and needs not listed above to help.

OPERATION FIRST RESPONSE

Currently served over 25,000+ heroes with emergency financial aid. Requests for financial aid must come from the request of a case worker, veterans administrative representative, or chain of command.




FIND YOUR STATE BENEFITS HERE

All 50 states offer the veterans designation on state-issued drivers license ID and plate. Quick requirements: discharge papers like DD214. Some offices require more documents. If you are 100% disabled you may receive a "disabled veteran" or a "women disabled veteran" license plate.

EXAMPLES OF WHAT TO LOOK FOR



1. PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS / HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS

Check your state benefits to see if you may be exempt from property taxes and homestead exemptions.



2. EMPLOYMENT RESOURCES

Check your state benefits to see if you may have employment resources you're able to tap into.



3. LAND

Check your state benefits to see if there is land you may able to procure at a discounted rate.



4. EDUCATION ASSISTANCE (FREE TUITION)

Check your state benefits to see if you or your dependents may qualify for free tuition at your states schools or universities.



5. EMERGENCY FAMILY ASSISTANCE FUNDS

Check your state benefits to see if you may apply for emergency family assistance funds.



6. HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSES

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for discounted or free hunting, fishing, or sportsmanship licenses.



7. DRIVERS LICENSE/AUTOMOBILE/WATERCRAFT REGISTRATION

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for waived drivers license fees, along with automobile and watercraft registration fees.



8. VETERANS HOMES/NURSING HOMES

Check your state benefits to see if you may have free or discounted veteran or state run nursing homes.



9. STATE, CITY, COUNTY, AND MUNICIPAL PARKS

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for free visitor or camping access to your state, city, county, and municipal parks.



10. BONUS PROGRAM FUNDS OR STIPENDS

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for special bonus program stipends: this may apply to some foreign war veterans.



11. HOME LOANS

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for discounted home loan rates.



12. INJURY RELIEF FUNDS

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for injury relief funds or grants.



13. BURIAL / CEMETARY

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for burial and cemetery benefits.



14. PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION DISCOUNTS

Check your state benefits to see if you may qualify for transportation discounts such as on the railroad, train, etc.



15. JOB PREFERENCE

RECEIVE 2023 STANDARD VETERAN IDENTIFICATION CARD FROM VA

Not the same as a Veterans Health Identification Card for health care (VHIC). However, this official VA card shows your proof of service. You can apply online and it usually arrives in the mail in less than three weeks.

MAIN WAY TO RETRIEVE VARIOUS DOCUMENTS

You can request documents from your Official Military Personnel File. You can review and download through the milConnect website.

Or you may also request through mail, in person, or by contacting your state or county veterans agency.

Documents include: DD-214, DD-215, report of separation, and other release papers. Locate your past military orders and endorsements, performance reports, awards, decorations, qualifications, licenses, certificates, and security clearance.



CHECK BURIAL AND MEMORIAL BENEFITS

Veterans who were released from active duty under circumstances other than dishonorable, service members who pass away while serving, as well as their spouses and dependent children, may be eligible for VA burial and memorial benefits. For qualified veterans, their spouses, and dependents, burial in a VA national cemetery is available at no cost to the family and consists of the gravesite, grave liner, opening and shutting of the grave, a monument or marker, and permanent care as part of a national shrine. Military funeral honors are additional advantages for veterans. Veterans' loved ones may request Presidential Memorial Certificates from their families.

Regardless of their date of death, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) provides, upon request and at no cost to the applicant, a government headstone or marker for any deceased qualified veteran's unmarked grave in any cemetery anywhere in the globe. https://www.benefits.gov/benefit/276



DEPENDENCY AND INDEMNITY COMPENSATION FOR SURVIVING DEPENDENTS | SPOUSES | CHILDREN | PARENTS

In the worst case scenario of a veteran spouse who passes away from a service connected disability or in action, there are bereavement counseling at VA centers. Additionally, there is a "Dependency and Indemnity (D&I) or survivors pension" which is compensation for surviving dependents and spouses.
